Requests for displays should be directed to the Curator of the PHILAS Collection and at least two months notice is required for a display. A second choice should also be indicated, as the first collection may not be available. It is not advisable to include a specific PHILAS display on the Club Programme without first booking it with PHILAS, as the required material may have already been booked by another club. The Nita Wilson Collection of Privately-ordered Aerogrammes in 4 volumes, including Mrs Wilson's correspondence and mint and used aerogrammes is available for research in PHILAS House only.

**CLUB PACKS** consist of world stamp lots (sets and singles) ready for sale at club meetings. PHILAS Club Pack provides many benefits to clubs, but it is necessary to book your "Club Pack" at least two months in advance from the Convener, PHILAS Club Pack, PO Box 220, Darlinghurst NSW 1300.

THE PHILAS LIBRARY is a specialist philatelic library containing over 6000 books, journals and catalogues. Much of this has been built up from donations and the many donors are warmly thanked for their contributions to the hobby. The PHILAS Library Inc now has Donated Gift Recipient status with the Australian Taxation Office, and all donations over \$2 are tax deductible. The library is open to the public for research purposes Tuesday and Saturday 9am to 3.30pm, and at other times by appointment. Most books may be borrowed, for up to one month, by members of affiliated societies. Country members can arrange to borrow items through their society secretary.



# **Sydney Youth Stamp Group SYSG Meeting**

# 13th July Workshop ~ Theme Postmarks

Paul Storm ran the Seniors Group program with 19 participants. He was assisted by Michael Gortley, Linda Lee and Ruth Mitchell. After Lenore Callender described the Open Day program the Seniors Group remained on Level 1 to view the display by Linda Lee on "Postmarks". This display comprised 16 pages from a thematic exhibit with a range of postmarks from different countries and dates. A question sheet on the display was distributed and the Seniors were asked to hand their completed copies in for marking.

The rest of the Seniors Group Program was held on level 2. An extra table was provided, as requested, which meant that the participants could comfortably spread out. The Seniors then worked on a catalogue exercise to find some Australian issues where the used stamps were valued at the same cost or greater than the new stamps. Following this Paul introduced the concept of "Entires" and showed everyone how to make a postmark using their initials in the design. The designs were then transferred to lino ready for inking and placing in the indicia area of the entire. This next step will be done in the October Open Day.

The first session after lunch was "Swaps and Buying" which was very popular, as usual. In the final session the group completed a word sort puzzle on "Postmarks" and then played two rounds of Bird Stamp Bingo before joining the Juniors Group for the closing session.



### Senior Group Busy at Work in The Library

Lenore welcomed 6 participants to the junior workshop. Lenore was ably assisted by Mal Nicholson, Janine Minogue and Norma Stapleton. Although this number of participants was low it was pleasing to note that all but two of the senior group had started SSYG in the junior group. The day commenced with Mal giving an outline of the types of postmarks used. After this presentation the juniors completed a lengthy exercise naming which type of postmark had been used on the examples shown. Linda Lee then presented her display after which the juniors answered a quiz based on the display.

As July was the 50th anniversary of the introduction of postcodes, Mal gave an outline of postcodes and the codes used in Australia. After this the juniors were given a pile of cancelled PSE's to sort into states then they

had to place them in the various "state letterboxes" situated around the room.

After lunch the juniors enjoyed a swapping session, then moved on to activities of designing a pictorial postmark for the "town" they were given, and a concentration game. An exercise on how to address an envelope, followed by a game of country bingo rounded off a very full day.


# The Numeral Cancellations of New South Wales Second Edition



# A COMPARISON OF THE PHILATELY OF AUSTRALIA IN 1938 & 1988

by Richard C Peck, MAP, ACCL.

I collected the philately produced for Australia's Bicentennial year 1988 at the time and often wondered what had happened 50 years before. So I began to collect the philately of 1938 75 years after that event. My mother was one of those celebrating on Sydney Harbour on 26 January 1938. I entered a ballot to be present at the Opera House for the celebrations 50 years later.





The 1938 celebrations were run by the NSW government and lasted from 1 January to 25 April 1938 (Anzac Day). The 1988 celebrations were co-ordinated by the Australian Bicentennial Authority (ABA) across all states and lasted all year.





Although after the end of official celebrations the Australasian jamboree was considered a 150<sup>th</sup> event, by comparison we commenced with a Jamboree in 1988.

Newcastle Bicentennial Community Committee PO Box 1988 Newcastle West 2302

A set of three commemorative stamps (issued 1.10.37) were produced by the recess process. The best known varieties are the "man with tail" and various retouches. A special square size for all Bicentennial stamps saw historical issues commence in 1984 and for the first time, a complete definitive series issued. This was rather controversial on the theme "Living Together" as the designers were cartoonists. There was no Stamp Advisory Committee in 1937, I was a member from 1985 - 1990. By this time, stamps were produced by offset photo lithography with few noted varieties for the avid collector.







Some of the major events for 1938 received special event postmarkers which were just beginning to be popular in the 1930s. While these had become rubber based by 1988 there was also a set of specially commissioned "200 Club" pre-stamped envelopes to satisfy the needs of those many organisations who did not qualify for pictorial postmarks.





In 1938, despite the Munich Agreement, there was foreboding that a new world war was inevitable. The major visiting warship contingent had been American. In contrast the 1988 event was very much multi-national.





In 1938 the main means of communication was wireless, supplemented by newspaper and glossy weekly magazines and your weekly trip to the cinema where the news reels were projected. In 1988 it was television (as the world wide web had not then been invented. My last book produced on the typewriter was *Bicentennial Philately*.) *World Expo 88* trialled the use of product barcodes and scanners.







One of the major differences was that the ABA had major words and even dates copyrighted under licence to itself thus aiming to be self-funding.



Scene from the 1938 landing. Parramatta was among the first to celebrate its Bicentennary, in November 1938. As can be seen, the ephemeral material was on both cases, based on local needs and demand though in 1938 there were more labels or poster stamps and in 1988 more souvenir covers appropriately cacheted and/or signed. In both cases, once the initial occasion had passed, the items were equally as hard to come by. I built up my 1938 collection largely from Ebay. By comparison, my 1988 material was acquired from stamp dealers like Manfred Junge or Ron Madden (Mad on Stamps). The ratio of 1938:1988 items is about 1:3.
