The organisers of the SYDPEX 80 exhibition did produce a unique item by putting together the sheet printing arrangement of the miniature sheets. This collection of 25 numbered sheets was issued inside a pre-printed envelope showing an image of the special postmark in black on the outside.



A double sided printed card inserted explained the sheet printing arrangement.

The text on the other side explains the following: "This set of miniature sheets was produced from each of the 25 positions on the complete printers'

sheet which are identified by the numbers on the diagram. The miniature sheet and stamps were designed by Bruce Weatherhead of Melbourne and printed by Asher & Co., Division of Leigh-Mardon Pty. Ltd., on a Roland Rekord 4-colour Press. The additional printing was commissioned by the Philatelic Exhibition Council of N.S.W. for SYDPEX 80 National Stamp Exhibition and printed on a Roland Parva Single Colour Press."


A set of 25 miniature sheets were contained inside the envelope. One numbered sheet was overprinted 'SYPEX-80 / NATIONAL STAMP EXHIBITION / SYDNEY 1908'.



The other sheets are numbered 1 to 25 and overprinted 'NATIONAL STAMP EXHIBITION SYDPEX 80' with the SYDPEX 80 arranged on logo format.




Other miniatures sheets were overprinted with the closing day in red and all other days in black.





A National Stamp Week Miniature Sheet was overprinted on the back providing details for the Exhibition Dinner held at Tattersalls Club on the 4th October 1980.




A miniature sheet with Sydpex 80 imprint in blue issued by Argentina has been noted.

Dulwich Hill Marrickville Philatelic Society

The Dulwich Hill Marrickville Philatelic Society issued together with the Philatelic Exhibition Council of N.S.W. a souvenir card showing 15 early Sydney postmarks.

The PHILAS House Appeal was not closed as this souvenir card demonstrates.



Guba Essav

In 1939 Australia Post prepared a 5 shilling stamp with the intention that they should be attached to mail across the Indian Ocean carried by Captain P. G. Taylor carried on his amphibian aircraft Guba II.

Because of public comments received Australia Post did not proceed with the issue.

Over 40 years later the Guba essay surfaced, with full authority of Australia Post, as an imprint block of 4 in the original colour at SYDPEX 80.




Together with this reproduction comes a 10 page 'Story of the Guba' written by Mr. N. Sheppard. Australia Post exhibited a full sheet (not perforated). A Sydney dealer purchased a quantity of catalogues, removed and perforated the blocks of for and sold them to collectors.

Letter Sheet of 1838

The following seal is from a reproduction produced for the SYDPEX 80 on a letter sheet221 mm x 285 mm.




The letter sheet (buff paper) has been imprinted on the back with the following:



Registered labels

In appreciation to workers at the exhibition of their efforts in leading up to and work at the show they were given sheetlets of 10 labels. They were never put on sale and for that reason have been elusive.



The sheets are printed in two colours with an old fashioned red posting box alongside the registration label which are all sequentially numbered.

Registered envelopes with registration labels are rare.

Sydney Stamp Exhibition 1986 Stamp & Coin Show

The Sydney Stamp & Coin Show was held from 31st October to 2nd November 1986 at the Lower Town Hall, Sydney.

As 1986 was the International year of peace the design incorporated four 50c stamps showing a Dove of Peace and the logo of the exhibition.



All sheets are numbered in red.

The size of the envelopes imprinted with a special cachet was 255 mm x 180 mm



Green colour for the special postmark has been used on the opening day.

Blue colour double print has been noted.



During the show black ink was used for the special postmark.



Red ink was used for the special postmark on the last day of the show



Sydney Stamp Exhibition 1988

A stamp exhibition was held from the 30th July to the 7th August 1988 at the Royal Australian Showgrounds. SYDPEX 88 also celebrated the Bicentennial National Stamp Exhibition.

ACT Philatelic Council

The ACT Philatelic Council arranged a lottery to assist in funding SYDPEX 88.




Prizes were supplied by Australia Post.



The souvenir sheet was designed by Mr. Richard Peck using actual size colour design transparencies supplied by Australia Post Graphic Design. Printing was carried out by letterpress Kwik Kopy printing, Sydney and pin perforated (1 mm diameter using a hand press). Quantity printed was 3000 sold at \$10 each.

Airships Pacific

Airships Pacific Ltd., gave permission to the exhibition council to print labels showing an A600 airship operated by Airships Pacific.



This is a blue label intended for correspondence and used as the principal publicity label.



Printed in magenta and value of \$1.00 shown is the rate for carrying a cover by airship.

Both labels are printed on self adhesive paper rouletted between.

Airships Pacific carried 1000 covers on a first flight in South Korea advertising the Olympic Games 1988. Envelopes to be signed by the pilot and returned to the exhibition council.

Angel Vignette. – Cinderella Club

A special meeting for members and guests was organised by the Cinderella Club of Australasia.



Note: the Australian Airmail Catalogue, Nelson Eustis mentions first usage as 23rd September 1925. Date on card appears to be incorrect.

SYDPEX 88

A souvenir sheet was issued incorporating the SYDPEX 88 and AUSTAMP 90 logos.

The sheets were printed on gummed white paper rouletted 5.

Harrison Essay

Mr R. A. Harrison prepared (circa 1930) a series of stamps showing Australian tourist attractions. The series was never published.



One of the essays showed the rock formation in Katoomba, New South Wales, referred to as the 'Three Sisters'. For SYDPEX 88 the essay was issued printed on white, not perforated paper in four colours, blue, red, orange and green.

Publicity label


Publicity labels were printed in sheets of 25 (5 rows and 5 columns), perforated 13.25.





Stamp News

Stamp News was official stamp magazine to the exhibition.



A number of 1980 miniature sheets were overprinted and sold at their stand at the exhibition.

Maximum Cards

Several maximum cards were overprinted with the SYDPEX 88 logo and R.A.S Showground, 30.7.88 to 7.8.88, Don't Forget your SYDPEX Souvenirs.

Cards overprinted are:

- Fishing (ASPC 033),
- Xmas '79 (ASPC 029),
- Waltzing Matilda cards I (042), 4 (045) and 5 (46).
- There may be others.

Replica card

A replica card was enclosed in each exhibition catalogue.



The card reproduces the Three Pence New South Wales stamp of 1856.

Austria

The Post office of Austria provided a very attractive card.



British Post Office

The British Post Office issued a souvenir card.



Isle of Man



The Isle of Man Postal Authority issued a commemorative card to mark their participation.

Nauru Post Office



Nauru produced a pre-stamped card to commemorate participation.



Publicity labels were printed in sheets of 15, rouletted on self-adhesive paper.

New Zealand Post Office

This very unusual card was produced by the New Zealand Post Office for sale at its stand ad SYDPEX 88 and was designed as an 'Across the


Tasman' congratulatory card to Australia on its Bicentenary.

United States Postal Services



The US Postal Services issued an airmail card.

Sydney Stamp and Coin Fair - overprint

The Sydney Stamp and Coin Fair was held from 11th to 13 November 1988, Sydney Town Hall, Sydney, New South Wales.

Ian Kitchin Stamps and Coins, 133a Nepean Highway, Aspendale, Vic 3195 produced an overprint on the gutter of the 37c Early Years Bicentenary stamp. On this gutter the dark blue overprint showing line drawings of the First Fleet ships and the wording THE FIRST FLEET (in script type) and STAMP AND / COIN SHOW . SYDNEY / NOVEMBER 11-13 1988.

1500 overprints were made by A. A. Wade Graphics.

Sydney Stamp Expo 2011

The Sydney Stamp Expo was held from 31st March until 3rd April 2011 at Royal Randwick Racecourse.


Four differently coloured gummed sheets (207.5 mm x 217.5 mm) were offered, each containing 20 (5x4) rouletted labels.




