As my left eye has been operated on 3 years ago this is very inconvenient for me as it slows down everything I do. No sight – no stamp collecting – computer work.



The top of their game booklet (72 pages) contains 8 miniature sheets with a block of 4 of each stamp and was sold for \$19.95 at post office outlets





Cinderellas (11)

The Airmail Society of Australia staged a pigeongram Service on the 16th November. The pigeons flew to different parts of the City but pigeongrams were returned and then posted in special covers bearing the exhibition postmark and the Airmail cachet and market at the top left corner with the number of the particular pigeongram.

The first Australian 'Autogiro' flight took place between Melbourne to Portland on 16 November 1934.



The above card was carried on this flight.

Melbourne Stationary Exhibition 1935

Australasian Philatelic first Stationary Exhibition was held on the 18th September 1935. It was held in the building of the Australian Railways Institute.



A label in form of a pillar letter box was (believed) printed in strips of 3 and rouletted between.

Melbourne Stamp Exhibition 1937

The Air Mail Society of Australia organised at the Town Hall from the 5th to the 7th October 1937 a stamp exhibition.



Four labels printed in commemorative sheetlets were issued for the event. The perforation is 11. The labels come in four colours: blue, red, green and brown. Sheetlets are known not perforated.



A special postmarker was used for the exhibition.

Melbourne Stamp Exhibition 1950

The Australian National Philatelic Exhibition (ANPEX) and Centenary of Australian Postage Stamps was held from the 4th to the 14th October 1950.

Issued labels show the first stamps of New South Wales (1d Sydney View) and Victoria (3d sitting Queen Victoria).



Labels were printed in sheets of 12 (3 rows of 4) and the first label in the third row was inverted.



Perforation used rough 11.

Labels are known overprinted in bright green (above) and black (below) with the dates of the exhibition across the top of the label (OCT. 4 ----14th) and a line across the centre of the two facsimiles.

A special 52 mm diameter postmarker was used during the exhibition.

For additional labels see <u>ANPEX 1950</u>. For Adelaide overprints see Adelaide Stamp Exhibition 1951.

Melbourne Stamp Exhibition 1963

The 12th International Philatelic Exhibition was staged in Melbourne from the 7th to the 12th October 1963. It was called MIPEX and was under the auspices of The Royal Philatelic Society of Victoria, the Victorian Philatelic Association and the Philatelic Societies of Victoria.

Due to lack of space the exhibition was at two locations. The Lower Town Hall was used as well as the Preston Motors Showroom. Many international exhibits could be seen include some from Latin America.

Two different postmarks can be noted.



One postmark included a design for the exhibition logo Bared Numeral used in Victoria in succession to the Butterfly postmark. and the other the Barred Numeral

On the 5th October an experimental Hoover craft carried Special Flight Covers over the Yarra River.

Melbourne Stamp Exhibition 1970 (Brighton) A stamp exhibition, organised by the Brighton Philatelic Society, was held at Brighton Town Hall from 25th to 27th September 1970.



A label (60mm x 80mm) was issued printed in black on blue paper.

Melbourne International Centenary 1980

The Victorian Stamp promoting Council issued a miniature sheet relating to The Melbourne International Centenary Exhibition from 23rd September to 5th October 1980 depicting the Exhibition Building and an image similar to the 1951 Foundation of the Commonwealth stamp (without value 5 ½ d) and numbered sheetlets were printed at The House of Questa, London, England in a quantity of 50 000. This came about as Australia Post refused to issue commemorative stamps marking the occasion.



The historic Exhibition Building (the Proclamation Ceremony shown in the stamp was held in the Exhibition Building in 1901) was completed in 1880 and has a floor space of over 26 000 square metres. It is one of Melbourne's great landmarks. The sheet comes in a specially designed printed envelope illustrating and giving a history of the Exhibition Building.

The sheet was designed by Mr Ray Honisett.



Melbourne Stamp and Coin Show1986

The Stamp and Coin Show was held from 21st to 23rd march 1986 at the Royal Exhibition Building, Melbourne.



Two errors should be noted:


- 1. the year states 1985 instead of 1986;

Melbourne Stamp Exhibition 1989

A stamp exhibition called STAMPSHOW 89 was held on 18th to 22nd October 1989 at the Royal Exhibition Building, Melbourne. The main theme of the exhibition centred on Melbourne trams.

Souvenir sheets of 10 publicity labels showing a Melbourne tram printed in green on black on white gummed paper perforated 11 went on sale during SYDPEX 88.



Melbourne Stamp and Coin Show 1991

The Australian Philatelic Federation, the Australian Philatelic Federation and the Victorian Philatelic Council organised and held a stamp and coin show at the Royal Exhibition Building, Melbourne from 19th to 21st July 1991.





Publicity labels were issued.



The season ticket also carried logos of supporting organisations.

Melbourne-Sydney Flight

The vignettes illustrated here were issued for attaching to mail carried on a flight made from July 16-18, 1964 from Melbourne to Sydney, to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the first air mail flight in Australia - by Maurice Guillaux in 1914. The vignettes were produced in miniature sheet format of four labels. They were printed pale blue and brown and feature Guillaux' plane. The vignettes were designed by E. W. Roberts and printed by the Griffin Press, Adelaide.



In 1967 the vignettes were overprinted "WATSON 1917-1967" and bars for a special flight Mt Gambier to Melbourne to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of a flight over this route by Basil Watson in 1917. The overprints were applied by the Hobby Shop Pty. Ltd., Adelaide.

Melbourne Patriotic Flight

On June 28, 1943 a special Pigeongram flight from the roof of the Melbourne Town Hall was organised in conjunction with a state-wide appeal for funds for members of the Allied Fighting Forces. The 200 pigeons used on the occasion were made available by the Australian Army carrier pigeon service and the Victorian Homing Association and to the leg of each bird was attached a flimsie bearing a typed message to a prominent citizen. The message on each flimsie read:

ALLIES DAY APPEAL.

"They Shall Fight On."

This message comes to you in a unique form per carrier pigeon, and is an appeal for financial donations for our gallant Allies, and the response from the evergenerous citizens of Melbourne will be devoted to providing relief among members of the following Allied Fighting Forces:-Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Fighting French, Greece, Poland and Yugoslavia.

These countries are looking to English-speaking nations to assist them in their hour of dire need, as they are quite unable to obtain any assistance from their own people, under enemy domination. Your valued assistance would be gratefully acknowledged by me in the press on behalf of the fund.

When the birds returned to their lofts the flimsies were collected and were forwarded by post or the messages telephoned to the addressees appealing for funds.

There are 10 different designs, each on peel and stick white glossy paper (about 53 mm x 20 mm) printed in A4 sized sheets of 50 using three colours plus black produced by Mr. Tim Drysdale, South Australia in February 1991.



The cartoons by Mr. Stephen 'Lafferty' Stanley are in black. Labels were printed by letterpress Pty Ltd, Adelaide with the initial print run of 5000 sheets. The stock used is Fason FasPrint Clean Cut Perm. Sheets were sold for \$2.00 each including postage.

MLC

In 1886 The Citizens Life Assurance Company Ltd. Was incorporated in Sydney by Mr. James Garvan, Managing Director of The City Mutual. Following Australian Federation in 1901 the two

companies amalgamated to become the Mutual Life and Citizens Assurance Company limited, better known as MLC.



In 1936 the company celebrated its first 50 years of existence. The label was used on mailed items.
