Geelong Stamp Exhibition 1952

The Geelong Philatelic Society organised a stamp exhibition from 8th to the 10th May 1952 called GEEBEX to celebrate the society's 21st anniversary.



A label printed black on buff, perforated was issued and can be found with the special Post Office triangular postmarker.

Geelong Stamp Exhibition 1966

A two day exhibition was held on the 21st and 22nd October 1966 (GEEPEX) organised by the Geelong Philatelic Society to celebrate their 35th anniversary at the Winter & Taylor Pty Ltd showrooms.



Over 1000 sheets were on display. A commemorative cachet was used on souvenir envelopes with a green coloured cancel applied by the Post Office.

Geelong Philatelic Exhibition 1991

The Geelong Philatelic Society celebrated their 60th anniversary (1931 to 1991) by staging as philatelic exhibition (GEEBEX) at the Newcomb Community Centre, Bellerine Highway.



A souvenir sheet was issued to commemorate the event. The sheet shows the Eastern Beach with shark protection. The T & G Clock is located on the Temperance and General Building, Moorabool Street. The Barred Numeral 2 was the cancel allocated to Geelong. The sheet was printed on cream Davac paper rouletted 9.6 limited to 1000 sheets.



A publicity label was also issued in blue on Davac paper in sheets of fifteen issue limited to 1000 sheets designed by Ron Kershaw and R. Grundell.


A limited quantity of sheets was used on 28th April 1991 together with a 43c Frama label and Geelong's City By The Bay postmarker.

Glenorchy Stamp Exhibition

A Philatelic Exhibition sponsored by the Glenorchy Philatelic Society was held from 20th may to 22nd May 1965 in the Town Hall Glenorchy.

At the time of the exhibition the society was only six months in existence. The local Council made the upper foyer available to the Society under the condition that no admission fee be charged. A local firm provided display frames made from carton and polythene sheets. The competition was non-competitive. It was opened by the Minister for Tourism the Hon. Mr A. Atkins.




A souvenir sheet (issued: 500) was issued to assist in financing the exhibition.

GLENPEX 1972

A stamp exhibition (GLENPEX 72) was organised by the Glen Innes Philatelic Society in conjunction with the Municipal Centenary of Glen Innes.

Gold Coast Queensland 1978

On the 15th January 1978 the Gold Coast Philatelic Society held a stamp day.



The facsimile of the 1974 issued 7c surfing stamp was reproduced in altered colours.

Goble Flight

In 1924 Wing Commander S. J. Goble and Flying Officer J. McIntyre made an around Australia flight in a RAAF Fairy IIIId seaplane. They departed from Point Cook, near Melbourne on

April 6 and returned on May 19, after a flight around the coast of some 13,600 kilometres. Their touchdowns included Thursday Island. It was the first such flight to circle Australia by air.



A small quantity of unofficial mail was carried on the flight and for the occasion "Pals", a children's weekly magazine published by the Herald and Weekly Times Ltd of Melbourne, produced a label as illustrated featuring Wing Commander Goble. These were printed maroon on white unwatermarked paper and produced in miniature sheet format in blocks of four.

It is not known how many covers were carried or, indeed, whether these labels were affixed to envelopes carried on the flight but as the labels were issued for a specific flight they are listed here for the record.

In the early 1920's the Herald & Weekly Times Ltd also produced a number of souvenir labels to promote a children's magazine "Pals". These labels had designs featuring Australian scenes, birds and animals. These are often mistaken for stamps, but they are purely publicity labels having no association of any kind with any postal or delivery service so are not listed in this handbook.

Grahame Book Company

Grahame Book Company shop was located in 1946 at corners Martin Place and Elizabeth Streets, Sydney, New South Wales.

In mid 1947 the shop moved to 34 Hunter Street, Sydney and at that time had branches in Bankstown, East Garden, north Sydney, Wollongong, Erina, and Tuggeranong, A.C. T.



This label was usually affixed in the bottom right hand corner inside the front cover.



Those labels were used later.

Graves

H Graves & Co Parcel Delivery, Adelaide was issued circa 1910 at six pence. H Graves operated in Adelaide from 1876 to 1959. It started operation in 1876 as Henry Graves, Teamster at Old Port Road (Port Adelaide?) and in 1880 became H Graves & Company, Carriers with addresses at Old Exchange, Adelaide and Port Adelaide.

By 1883 the company had become Forwarding Agents and General Carriers with a head office at 7 & 8 Old Exchange and branches at Port Adelaide, Gawler and Kapunda. In 1884 the firm moved head office to North Terrace and in 1886 it was at 117 North Terrace West. The Gawler and Kapunda offices had closed by then.

In 1888 the company moved to Curie Street which remained its head office until 1934. It had a Port Adelaide address at Lipson and Divett Streets, with another office at Port Germein from 1893 to 1895. In 1886 it had branches at Port Adelaide, North Terrace and principal railway stations. From 1903 to 1910 the company also had offices in Perth and Fremantle.

In 1911 the company merged with the company of Henry Hill and became Graves, Hill and Co Ltd. By 1916 there had been another name change to H

Graves and Co Globe Parcels Express of Australia Chambers, 39 Currie Street and Pirie Street.

In 1934 the head office was moved to 14 Currie Street and in 1942 to Davenport Chambers 26 Currie Street. It also had an office at 181-199 Gouger Street. By 1950 all operations were moved to the Gouger Street address and the last address in South Australian in the 1959 directory showed it still at this address. Presumably they then ceased operations or were taken over by another company.




The label may be of Adelaide origin as it has some similarities to the J R Cocking labels. It is the only item known. The label is about 66mm x 55 mm with a design size of 55 mm x 41 mm printed in dark green on white paper perforated 11.

The stamps probably used the lithographic printing process and the design may have been transferred from one master.

Only one example has been recorded.


The one shilling label paid for special post by pidgin.

Goulburn Promotion

This very colourful sheet of 4 \$1 labels was issued in the 198's to promote the tourist attractions of Goulburn, NSW, Australia's oldest inland city.



The designs feature the Australian Agrodome,

- the old Court House,
- the War memorial and

- Big Marino tourist attraction which is 18 metres long and over 15 metres high and weighs 97 tonnes.

Gower Wilson Memorial Hospital Labels

The label is relating to Lord Howe Island but close enough to be included in this section.



The labels are printed in sheets of 10 (2 x 5 vertical format).

Guba flight Essays

In 1939 the Australian Post Office prepared for issue a five shilling stamp which was to have been attached to mail carried on a flight across the Indian Ocean by Captain P. G. Taylor in his amphibian aircraft Guba-II. As a result of a storm of protests by philatelists, the Post Office did not proceed with the issue of this special stamp which would have come within the category of an official local - and therefore within the scope of this handbook.



More than forty years later the Guba Essay, as it is known to philatelists, surfaced in a different form. In the catalogue of the SYDPEX 80 National Stamp Exhibition held in Sydney there appeared a long article on the Taylor flight and the Guba issue and an imperforate imprint block of four of the Guba essay was produced in full colour by special arrangement with Australia Post. The SYDPEX 80 catalogues sold for \$1 each but too many were printed and the exhibition committee was left with a lot on its hands after the show. A Sydney dealer purchased a quantity of these and proceeded to remove the page containing the Guba essay. He

then had these PERFORATED and offered them for sale on the philatelic market at \$50 per block! By this action the dealer created a bogus philatelic item from an essay of an unissued official "local" stamp. I merely note their existence for the record and leave readers to work out for them selves the status of such an item.

Hardy Wine Labels

In 1997 Hardy House of South Australia produced labels for their wine bottles featuring single stamps of the 1937 zoological definitive series. All the labels in this series were for export to the UK .

Stamps used in this series were:

- ½ d Kangaroo (for the 1997 Shiraz-Cabernet Sauvignon),
- 4d Koala (for 1996 and 1997 Semillon Chardonnay),
- 6d Kookaburra (for 1996 and 1997 Riesling Gewurztraminer),
- 1/- LyreBird (for 1997 Grenache Shiraz).

Some of the earlier Hardy stamp design labels were also used in wines sold in Australia.

Hayles Magnetic Island

Hayles Magnetic Island Pty Ltd is a company which for many years has operated a ferry service between Townsville (north Queensland) and nearby Magnetic Island. Passengers and freight are carried on the service and from the early 1920's the company has issued its own stamps for attaching to parcels carried TO the island. The stamps are not used on the reverse route.

The stamps are sold in bulk to Townsville businessmen who affix the stamps to parcels before consigning them to customers on the island. The stamps are cancelled by crayon to prevent re-use. The stamps are assembled into booklets and sold in this form. Since the inception of the service the stamps have been printed by H. W. Hastings & Sons, printers of Townsville.

All the stamps have a fairly utilitarian design. The earlier issues all incorporated the denominations and the words HAYLES MAGNETIC / ISLAND LIMITED / FREIGHT with scrolled frames with varying backgrounds in the lower section containing the denominations. There is considerable variation in this background shading even on stamps from the same sheet but there are three basic types of background which I have assigned as follows.



Type 1 Curved dotted pattern.



Type 2 Light open floral design



Type 3 closed floral design

Due to the lack of records it is not possible to assign with any certainty dates of issue or the order in which some printings appear and I would stress that the listing below (at least so far as the earlier issues are concerned) is based on educated guesswork.

FIRST ISSUE (Circa 1922) Unwatermarked on white paper and rouletted 7.

- TYPE 1: 1 d Red
- TYPE 2: 3d Light Blue

Printings also are found in dark blue ink.

The 1d stamp was for newspapers and the 3d was for parcels. These rates remained unchanged throughout the 1920's and 1930's and the war years. There must have been many printings in this period and there are considerable shade differences but it is not possible to assign any sort of order to them.



SECOND ISSUE (Circa 1945). White paper. 1d Rouletted 7. 6d Perforated.

- TYPE 1: 1 d red
- TYPE 3: 6d Green (Perforated)
- TYPE ? : 2/- red.

Some time after World War II the original 3d blue stamp was withdrawn and replaced with a 6d denomination as the base rate for parcels, though the 1 d rate for newspapers was retained. The 1 d stamps were sold in booklets containing 120 stamps (10/-) and the 6d stamps were sold in booklets of 48 stamps (24/-).

THE RAILWAY AND OTHER PARCEL STAMPS OF AUSTRALIA lists a 2/- red value in this series but I have not sighted a specimen of this stamp so cannot assign a type number or provide information on how it was assembled.



Type 3.

THIRD SERIES. 1966, February 14, Decimal currency issue. Unwatermarked white paper, Rouletted 7. There is also a 10c, red, known to exist

TYPE 3: 5c green

There is a later 5c blue/green printing.

The stamps were printed in sheets of 12 (3 x 4) and assembled into booklets of 48 which were sold at \$2.40.



Type 4.

FOURTH SERIES. Date unknown. White paper. Rouletted.



TYPE 4: 20c Red

These stamps were printed in sheets of 8 (2 x 4) and assembled into booklets of 40 sold at \$8.

Herald & Weekly Times

In June and July 1920 "The Herald and Weekly Times" of Melbourne carried out several experimental flights to Victorian country centres to test the feasibility of transporting newspapers by air. A railway strike prompted the company to extend the service to cover letters on an experimental flight made on July 26, 1920 in an Armstrong Whitworth piloted by Captain C. W. Leggatt. Letters lodged at the "Herald" office up to 3 p.m. on the day of the flight were accepted, and the plane departed at 3.25 p.m., arriving at Traralgon at 5.25 p.m. Stops were also made at Warragul and Trafalgar, whilst mails for Darnum, Yarragon, Moe and Morwell were dropped by parachute. It is possible that these were the world's first parachute mails. A total of 796 letters were carried on this service. A charge of one shilling was made for each letter and a special Herald Aerial Delivery label (Type 1) had to be affixed to each letter. These were printed in violet on yellow paper and included in the design a reproduction of the badge of the Australian Flying Corps (Later the R.A.A.F). The stamps were cancelled by means of a rubber stamp "HERALD AND WEEKLY TIMES, LTD - RECEIVED". The envelopes bore ordinary postage stamps in addition to the "Herald" labels and on receipt at the various towns the "Herald" agents posted the letters at the local Post Office.



Type 1

The rate was 1 ½ d per cover. The rouletted vignette with cancel of the herald Office was affixed to all mail. The papers were flown to overcome a railway strike. 769 letters were also carried. The plane landed at Warragul, Traralgon and Traralgon.



1920 (July 30) Melbourne-Traralgon flight cover AAMC #47 with a superb example of the violet/yellow 'HERALD/AERIAL/DELIVERY' label tied to the face by 'HERALD & WEEKLY TIMES' 'clock' cancels and West Australia ½d (fault) & 'ONE PENNY' on 2d cancelled on arrival with 'TRARALGON/VIC' cancel. Most examples seen have faults such as vertical folds, toning etc. In addition, most are overfranked, this being one of the few known paid at the correct rate of 1½d.



Reprint as block of four



Type 2

10th August 1920 – Melbourne to Hamilton. 700 postal items. The Herald and Weekly Times planned a weekly service but only the first flight was carried out.

Colours:

- Dark brown;
- Red



Reprint as block of four

The next flight was made August 10, 1920. The flight was to have been to Hamilton but a fierce storm forced the pilot (again Captain Leggatt) down at Willaura and the 700 pieces of mail were rushed from there by car to Hamilton. For this flight a different label (Type 2) was prepared with the words. "HERALD AIR MAIL" in script and a plane. The label was in brown on buff paper.

Between September 27 and December 1920 "The Herald and Weekly Times" conducted a series of flights to advertise a boys' magazine "Pals". The machine used was a Maurice Farnum 80 hp which was piloted in Victoria and N.S.W. by R. G. Caret' and from the Queensland border to the Gulf of Carpentaria by C. R. MacPherson. Thousands of leaflets were dropped over country towns and some mails were carried but no records were kept. A label as Type 3 printed red on buff was prepared and was affixed to each letter.



Type 3

27th September 1920. An 80 hp Maurice Farman Bi-Plane in command of R.C. Carey and his mechanic L.R. Macpherson, left Melbourne on a promotional flight for 'PALS' boys magazine to drop leaflets and letters at NSW and Victorian towns. After flying 2 500 miles over 36 district, Carey handed over control of the aircraft to Macpherson, who flew the aircraft to Queensland and Carey returned overland to Melbourne.

Type 4

17th April 1922 – Herald Weekly Times of Melbourne – arranged for an experimental air mail service from Melbourne to Geelong. Dark blue



The "Herald and Weekly Times" did not proceed with their plans for regular air services but did carry out another mail carrying flight in 1922 to Geelong. This was made in conjunction with the "Back to Geelong" celebrations conducted on Easter Monday, April 17. Letters were carried free of charge on this flight but a special "Herald" sticker was attached to each item. This had a design as Type 4 with the words "HERALD" (in Old English type) "AIR MAIL" and a plane. The labels were printed in blue ink on white paper. Two planes were used to carry the mails and newspapers on this flight, a Gnu and an Avro. The planes left Melbourne at 3.57 p.m. carrying a total of 15,000 letters, and reached Geelong 35 minutes later. Over 800 letters were carried on the return trip and these also bore the "Herald" labels. Sheets of 20 labels printed .

Heritage Stamps


Those labels were issued in 1993 by Mr. John H. Lilley when he owned Heritage Stamps, 95 Westfield Street, Maddington WA 6109. Mr Lilley is a licensed auctioneer and Valuer.



Mr Lilley advised that only 1000 sheets were produced and that he will produce a similar sheet every year. Collectors could order a sheet for \$3.00.

Hobart Stamp Exhibition 1982/83

A Philatelic Congress was held on the 6th and 7th March 1982 organised by the Philatelic Association of Tasmania.



A recess printed souvenir card was issued produced by H. & C. Best at the offices of the 'Courier' Hobart.

Hobart Stamp Exhibition 1985

A non-competitive Stamp and Postal History Exhibition was held in the Tasmanian Museum in late August 1985.

Hobart Stamp Exhibition 1989

A stamp exhibition (PHILATAS 89) was held from the 10th to the 12th June 1989 at the Derwent Regional Centre, Hobart, Tasmania.



The major fund raiser was a Frama souvenir sheet. There are two types. Type I contained three 37c Frama labels in the Echidna design. 1450 sheets were sold. This sheet was printed by Mercury-Walsh on a Heidelberg GTO offset press on Kantac New Age on matt self-adhesive paper. Issue date is 11 August 1988. No first day covers were produced. 300 last day covers were produced (27th September 1988).



The Type II sheet contains three 39c Frama labels in the Ring Tailed Possum design with an initial run of 1150. 300 first day covers were produced. Covers are dated 28th September 1988. The price increase is due to a change in postal rates. A few of the sheets use the earlier yellow backing paper (scarce). Both sheets were blue but a subsequent and final print run has a green border.

A third printing was required for sale at the exhibition. This one was in green instead of blue as for the first to sheets.

Hordern Brothers

The label is perforated and blue issued by the Hordern Brothers, 203-211 Pitt Street, Sydney, New South Wales.



Hordern Brothers was a large store and may have produced other labels.

Inter-City Parcel Express Co
The label illustrated here is believed to be of Australian origin but I have been unable to ascertain which cities were involved as the intercity Parcel Express Company is not listed under that name in current directories.



The charge of three shillings would indicate that the service may have operated in the post-war years as that would have represented a fairly normal charge for a small parcel from (say) Sydney to Melbourne in that period. The labels were printed in blue on white paper. They would appear to fall within the definition of locals but more information is needed on the service itself and whether the stamp appeared in other denominations than this 3/- example.

Interplanetary (Venus) Postage

As is the case with all UFO material: there is no proof. Those stamps have been around for a long time.



It is thought that an Australian soap manufacturer in the 1950 produced them for promotional purposes.

Insist on a 40 Hour Week

This label was produced by the Printing Trades Union to gain the 40-hour week.



James Berry Design

In 1954 "Stamp News" conducted a stamp design competition which was won by the well known stamp designer, Mr James Berry, of New Zealand. His entry comprised 17 designs which he had originally submitted in an Australian Post Office design competition of 1947 but which the Post Office rejected because Mr Berry was not a resident of Australia.



To publicise the campaign which "Stamp News" was then running to secure better Australian stamps, one of the designs (for a Canberra stamp) was selected and a quantity of essay sheets were prepared. The designs were laid down in a block of four (2 x 2) and a letterpress block made plus an additional stereo so that the essays were printed 8-up (two adjacent blocks of four). They were printed letterpress by the Dubbo Printing Works on white gummed paper in dark purple ink and left imperforate. They were then guillotined into blocks of four and these were mailed to newspapers and Members of Parliament with a circular pointing out how good stamp designs could be achieved from one colour art work and seeking aid in the campaign to have the Post Office improve its stamp designs.

Copies of the sheet were given without charge to readers of "Stamp News" on request. The sheets were not marketed in any way but as some of the freely distributed specimens would have found their way into collections and may puzzle future generations of collectors the background story is provided here for the record.

John McGrath Adelaide

John McGrath Ltd., 224-225 North Terrace, Adelaide used those labels in books. There they can be found in the bottom right hand corner inside the front cover.



The bookshop has been at this location from 1930 to 1945 but was renamed in 1957 to become The Argonaut Bookshop.

John Woods & Co

The 9d stamp illustrated here was issued by John Woods & Company which operated a parcel delivery service from 2 & 4 Barrack Street, Sydney. The stamp printed pale blue on white paper and perforated 11.



The stamp is similar to those issued by William McCulloch & Co in Melbourne and there may have been a link between the two operations. The style of design and printing would indicate an origin in the 1880's but nothing is known of the date of issue, or the extent of this service.

Kemp Land



A phantom state created by Mr Bruce Henderson, Director of the International Council of Independent States (ICIS), PO Box 15-116, New Lynn, New Zealand.

Kemp Land claims to have a population (1996) of 600 000 citizens.

There appear to be five labels in the series and all of them are printed black on various coloured gummed papers and all are not perforated.

Kangaroo Island Lighthouses

This attractive publicity sheet of 4 \$1 labels was issued in 1990 by the Advanced Kingscote Association on Kangaroo Island (South Australia 5223) to promote tourism.




There are two small sized labels 30c (red paper) and 45c (yellow paper) and three large 90c (pink paper), \$1.50 (pink paper) and \$1.05 (orange paper). All have a common design.

The sheet features four lighthouses on the Island:

1. Cape due Coudic (1909) on the south west tip of the island,
2. Cape Borda (1858) a square lighthouse designed by Trinity House, London,
3. Cape Willoughby (1852) on the Dudley Peninsula, the islands oldest lighthouse and the
4. Kingscote Lighthouse overlooking Nepean Bay, a hybrid as it light was installed a century ago in Spencer Gulf, then moved to Cape Willoughby in 1932, then 'retired' to Kingscote Museum in 1976.

Stamps (45c triangular) have been issued showing President Kim Jong of the Arctic Academy of Arts and Science.



Kangaroo Protection Committee

The Kangaroo Protection Committee, Sydney, New South Wales issued this label.

A 75c National Park stamp showing trees, and a 45c (issued 1992) SHOWING Eric Gardo ('Be ever vigilant for anti-party splittist activity' and a

75c (1992) showing again Eric Gardo (As they hoarsely shouted the words to Antarctica, 'Tis for Thee, the tears welled in my eyes). The sender is Southern Stamps & Coins, P.O. Box 136, Mawson, Australian Antarctic Territory

Kingsford Smith – Vacuum Oil Company

Issued by the Vacuum Oil Company it advertises Plume motor spirit and Mobileoil being used by Kingsford Smith in one of his flights.



Kingsgrove 1989

The Kingsgrove Philatelic Society commemorated their 30th anniversary by staging a two day exhibition at the Scout Hall, Shaw Street, Kingsgrove, New South Wales on 27th and 28th May 1989.



A souvenir sheet was issued to mark the occasion. The sheet was designed by Mr Bob Kennedy. On the right side of the sheet two essays as shown developed by the Note Printing Branch but never adopted for the 1959 Christmas stamp. One essay was developed using a painting by Raphael and the other by Dürer. Only 120 sheets were produced. Of those 15 had the 1959 Christmas stamp on the back serviced with a special postmark prepared by the Society for the event.

The Societies logo was used to cachet 200 covers. No 2 to 100 cachet in green and the rest in red. The pre-stamped envelopes of history buildings were used for this purpose (39c Woodbridge and Werribee Park).

Korean World Philatelic Exhibition

For the Korean World Philatelic Exhibition from 22nd to 31st October 1984, Seoul, South Korea, Australia Post issued a souvenir card.



The card was available at Australia Post stand at the exhibition.
